Platteville Chosen To Host State AACTFest 2003



The Wisconsin Association of Community Theatre (WACT) is excited to announce The Platteville Community Theatre will be hosting the Wisconsin AACTFest 2003 on March 7, 8 and 9, 2003. The Platteville Community Theatre has entered the festival previously and is anxiously preparing to host this coming festival.

AACTFest is open to any community theatre in the State of Wisconsin that is governed by a board of directors from the community and has been in existence for at least two years. The production to be entered can be anything the company decides. It can be a one act, a cutting of a longer work, or an original script. Musicals, comedies and dramas are all acceptable. The production, as presented, must be no longer than sixty minutes. (If producing a cutting you must obtain permission to do so from the licensing agent) Additionally productions have a ten minute set up and ten minute strike. Each production is adjudicated by a panel of three judges immediately following the company's strike. Adjudication is open to the public as well as the producing company.

WACT is hoping to have at least ten entries at this year's festival. With ten entries Wisconsin is entitled to send two shows to the Region III Festival. This would be a first for Wisconsin and can be especially exciting as Wisconsin is also hosting the Region III AACTFest in Fort Atkinson, WI, on April 11, 12 & 13, 2003. The winning entry at the regional festival will continue on to the national AACTFest 2003 in Torrington, Connecticut, June 25 - 28, 2003.

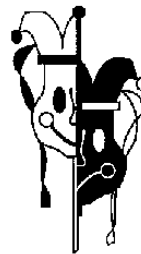
WACT invites all community theaters in Wisconsin to participate in this exciting and educational festival. However, if you feel your group is not ready to enter a production you are encouraged to register members of your group to be a part of the audience and cheer on their favorite production. After attending you might just decide, "Gee, our group can do better than that," and begin making plans to enter the next festival in 2005.

In past years groups from Wauwatosa, Platteville, La Crosse, Madison and Fond du Lac

have represented Wisconsin at the Regional festival. Madison, Fond du Lac and La Crosse have gone on to represent our region at national and international festivals.

Financial Report

WACT ended its fiscal year in the black. At a recent meeting of the board of directors, Treasurer Sandi Weber reported that WACT ended its fiscal year on July 31, 2002 with a net income of \$2,397.35. WACT still has an outstanding debit that we will be able to retire and still be in a stable financial position. WACT is now in the process of finalizing its application for 501(c)(3) nonprofit status and getting proper insurance. The budget passed for 2002 - 2003 calls for income of \$2,360.00 and total expenses of \$2,805. Although this budget reflects a deficit, the cash on hand should keep WACT in the black.

Thank You To The Sheboygan Theatre Company



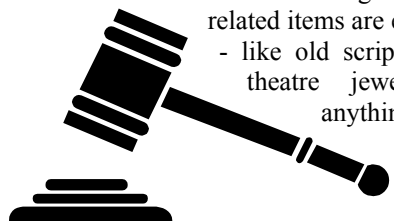
WACT would like to thank the Sheboygan Theatre Company and its director, Ralph Maffongelli for their donation of \$770.00. The

Send In The Clowns

While most familiar to theatre people as a song from *A Little Night Music*, the phrase has its origins in a different performance medium, the circus. "Send in the clowns" is the traditional act when a great tragedy happens at a circus performance. Because no matter how the company feels or how much emotional pain they may be feeling, the show must go on.

On August 21st, community theatre in Wisconsin suffered its own tragedy. Dawn Ender, only 44 years old passed away from cancer. Dawn's official title at the La Crosse Community Theatre was that of Costume Designer. In addition to official duties, she had unofficial duties



that went with being married to the Artistic/Managing Director. But Dawn was much more, she was a goodwill ambassador to the world. Anyone who met her would never forget her beaming smile, it could and would light up a room. An AACTFest fan, she and Morrie became familiar faces throughout the state and region with their award winning performances of *Cotton Patch Gospel* and the *Angels of Lemnos*. Theatre took her beyond the bounds of the United States allowing her to make friends from Germany to Japan.

One of Dawn's last bit of advice was to "Follow Dreams", a philosophy that she lived. A philosophy that is appropriate for theatre people everywhere. In her honor the La Crosse Community Theatre has established the Dawn M. Enders New Theatre Building Fund, looking towards the day when one of her dreams, a new theatre for the group, is ready to become a reality.

Dawn's passing should certainly generate a cry of "send in the clowns" from Wisconsin community theatre. And if clowns can come from heaven, Dawn will send them (in gorgeous costumes).
